ORDINANCE NO. 1997-2

AN ORDINANCE OPENING CERTAIN STREETS,
OR PORTIONS THEREOF, PREVIOUSLY LAID
OUT AND CURRENTLY FUNCTIONING AS STREETS
IN THE BOROUGH OF LILLY

NOW, THEREFORE, under and pursuant to Section 46731 of
the Borough Code, 53 Pa C.S.A. 46731, et. seq., be it Ordained
and Enacted by the Council of the Borough of Lilly, Cambria
County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1

The following streets, or portions thereof, between
the termini indicated, having previously been laid out and
currently functioning as streets within the Borough of Lilly,
are hereby opened and shall henceforth each be a public street
of the Borough of Lilly:

Hemlock Street - from Piper Street to Williams Street
Park Road - from Piper Street to Lilly Borough boundary
line
High Street Extension - from High Street to PA Route 53
Pine Street - from George Street to dead end
Hawthorne Street - from Barker Street to Cemetery Street
Railroad Street - from Grant Street to Lilly Borough
recycling location
Hagens Street - from Main Street to PA Route 53
Myers Lane - from Harris Street to PA Route 53
Popular Street - from Jones Street to dead end
Rose Street - from George Street and looping back to
George Street

the business authorized by the Borough of Lilly for the collection of recyclables.

SECTION 4. It shall be a violation of this Ordinance for any resident of the Borough of Lilly to:

A. Fail to, or improperly, separate, bundle, bag, carton, or otherwise package, or place at curbside, all glass containers, plastic containers, aluminum cans or newspapers in accordance with SECTION 2 above, and

B. Collect or dispose of, either directly or indirectly, any recyclable after it becomes the property of the Borough of Lilly, or its designee, in accordance with SECTION 3 above.

SECTION 5. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution, or, in default of payment of such fine and costs to undergo imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days, it being specifically provided that each day's violation of this Ordinance shall be deemed a separate violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. If any sentence, clause, section or part of this Ordinance is, for any reason, found to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses or sections or parts of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Borough of Lilly that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such

unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section, or any part hereof had not been included herein.

SECTION 7. All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, of the Borough of Lilly inconsistent are hereby repealed as to such inconsistency only.

SECTION 8. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately.
