

ORDINANCE 13

Of the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, fixing a tax of fifty cents (50) per pole upon all telegraph, telephone, electric light, or any other pole used to carry wires for the transmission of electric current.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that a tax of fifty cents (50) per pole per year be, and the same is hereby imposed upon all telegraph, telephone, and electric light companies for each pole within the limits of said Borough, used to wires for telegraph, telephone, or electric light, or electric power.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
