ORDINANCE 18

An ordinance of the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, and State of Pennsylvania.

Be it ordained by the Burgess and Town Council and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same: that from and after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for the owner or owners of cows to permit the same to run at large upon the streets, alleys, parks or commons of the Borough Of Lilly between the hours of 80'clock P.M. and 60'clock A.M. of each day.

Any person or persons who violate the provisions of this ordinance such be quily of any offense, and upon complaint made to the Burgess Or the Justice Of The Peace in said Borough, shall forfiet and pay for and as a fine for the use of said Borough the sum of, not less than(\$5) five dollars nor more than (\$10) ten dollars, to be collected as fines are by law collectible.

All ordinances inconsistant herewith are hereby repealed.
