ORDINANCE 30

An ordinance providing for the extension of the general system of public sewerage in the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to a General Sewerage Ordinance, which was passed by Council on August 3, 1920, and providing for the payment of the same and the collections of assessments thereon, through George Street, Barker Street, Corrigan Street, White Street, Portage Street and Ridge Alley.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Lilly, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that an extension to the general system of public sewers of said Borough be constructed for the purpose of disposal of waste and surface waters and other sewerage matters in the said Borough; the mains, drains and branches thereof shall be laid in a manner prescribed by and under the direction of the Borough Engineer, according to plans and specifications hereinafter adopted over and long the following portions of the highways hereinafter mentioned in the said Borough of Lilly as follows:

First. Beginning at a point in Church Street and extending northeasterly in a direction along George Street at a distance of 1650ffeetttooagpointk-neartthetBoroughrline. Street;

Second. Beginning at a point in Church Street and extending in a northeasterly direction a distance of 565 feet through Barker Street to Corrigan Street; thence extending in a westerly direction through Corrigan Street, a distance of 330 feet to White Street; thence extending trough White Street in a southwesterly direction a distance of 480 feet to a point near Church Street.

Third. Beginning at a point in Main Street souths of the concrete bridge and extending through an un-named alley east of Main Street, a distance of 972 feet to a point in Portage Street; thence along Portage Street in a northeasterly direction, a distance of 250 feet to a point 50 feet south of Cleveland Street.

Section 2. That for the purpose of defraying the costs and expense of said construction, the several properties fronting or abutting on the portions of the highways enumerated in Section 1 of this ordinance, within the Borough of Lilly, are hereby assessed the sum of \$1.00 for every foot front of their respective properties. Providing, however, that were a property owner that may own property on a corner, and thus his property abuts on two streets, he may have an option of paying a sum that will pay for the foot-front that is on the most narrow point; but in case a property owner may desire to tap into the sewers running on both streets that pass his property, then he must pay for the foot-front that may be on both streets that pass his property, then he must pay for the same.

Section 3. The Borough of Lilly must lay the main sewers on the street and must make the tap into themain sewer and lay the service lines from the main sewers up to the curb of the property owner. The above sum of \$1.00 per foot shall be due from the property owners whether they tap the sewers or whether they do not. The Secretary shall give the property owners notice of the sewer having being laid in front of their abutting properties, And the said foot-frontage at the rate of \$1.00 per foot shall be due and payable thirty days after the sewer has been placed up to thier curb and notice given of the same.

Section 4. The method of collection for this money due from property owners for sewers and laying of sewer pipes shall be as provided by statute by suit of assumpsit or by regular municiple lien against property so assessed, as provided for in Boroughs of this Commonwealth.

This ordinance is passed pursuant to a General Sewerage Ordinance passed August 3, 1920.

Any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same is hereby repealed so far as the same affects this ordinance.
