

ORDINANCE 31

An ordinance relating to running at large of cows, horses, mules, pigs, sheep and any of the young of said animals.

Be it ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Lilly, County of Cambria, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same, and that from and after the passage of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for the owner or owners of cows, horses, mules, pigs, sheep and any of the young of the said animals, to permit the same to run at large at any time upon the streets, alleys, parks, or the commons of the Borough of Lilly.

Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine for the use of the Borough in the sum of not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than ten (\$10.00).

~~This~~ ordinance to go into effect ten (10) days after the passage of the same by the Council, and after the signing of the same by the Burgess.

Any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same is hereby repealed so as the same effects this ordinance.
