

ORDINANCE 32

An ordinance providing for detour in the Borough of Lilly during the period required to construct highway route number 276 in the Borough of Lilly from station 1172 plus 71.6 to station 1189 plus 55.

Whereas, the State Highway Department is about to receive bids for the construction of state highway route No. 276 lying within the Borough of Lilly's limits, from station 1172 plus 71.6 to station 1189 plus 55, a distance of sixteen hundred and eighty four (1684) feet, as shown by the plans of the said State Highway Department.

And Whereas, it is necessary for the traveling public that they may be provided for their comfort and safety during the period of construction of this road, therefore,

Be It Resolved And Ordained on motion of Andrew Fees seconded by Harry M. Leahey, and carried, that the Secretary and President of Council be empowered to fix their signatures and to affix the seal of the Lilly Borough and the Burgess to be authorized to approve, if he will, a certain detour agreement with the State Highway Commissioner of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Be It Further Ordained, that all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE 32

R E S O L U T I O N

Whereas, the section of highway in Lilly Borough, Cambria County, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, being about 1684 feet in length and situated as follows: Beginning at the intersection of Cleveland and Main Streets on State Highway Route No. 276 at Station 1172 plus 71.6 to Station 1189 plus 55, extending along the present route of Main Street, from Station No. 1172 plus 71.6 to Station 1178, thence through private property to be acquired, to Station 1189 plus 55, is in need of improvement, and

Whereas, the Borough of Lilly desires to take advantage of the Act Approved June 12th, 1919, permitting Counties of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to appropriate and expend moneys for the improvement and maintenance of State Highways and State-Aid Highways or any public highway in any County of the Commonwealth, etc., therefore be it

Resolved, that the Borough Council of Lilly Borough, in regular session assembled on this 29th day of January 1923, do on behalf of said Borough hereby petition for County Aid as herein after stated.
