ORDINANCE 41

An ordinance prohibiting the use of the streets of the Borough of Lilly for parades or organized assemblages of any kind without a written permit from the Burgess of said Borough, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof.

Be it ordained and enacted by the Council of the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, State of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by and with the authority of the same, that after the passage of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any lodge, society or organization of any kind, or for any organized number of persons to use the streets of the Borough of Lilly, or public places therein, for the purpose of parading or marching or being thereon or therein, or for the purpose of assembling on said streets or in said public places in said Borough, without first obtaining from the Burgess of the said Boroughsoft without first obtaining from the Burgess of the said Boroughsoft written permit to do so, and any persons participating in such parade or assemblage without securing said written permit is guilty of a violation of this ordinance.

Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Burgess of Justice of the Peace of said Borough, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Five (\$5.00) dollars, nor more than three hundred (\$300.00) dollars, and in default of the payment thereof, with costs, shall undergo imprisonment in the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days.
