ORDINANCE 43

An ordinance of the Borough of Lilly, Countyof Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, repealing and making void ordinance which was passed finally by the Council of the Borough of Lilly on the 27th day of Bebruary, A.D., 1919 which required owners, proprietors and operators of Pool Rooms, Bowling Alleys, shooting galleries and Motion Picture Houses, operating within the Borough of Lilly, to procure a license before engaging in or continuing such business, providing for the Collection, use, amount of license and fixing a closing hour for such places of amusement. Now therefore be it enacted and ordained by the council of the Lully Borough, it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that the ordinance passed finally by the Council of the Borough of Lilly on the 27th day of Bebruary A.D., 1919, which required owners, proprietors and operators of Pool Rooms, Bowling Alleys, Shooting Galleries and Motion Picture Houses to pay a certain fee and also required said owners, proprietors, and operators to procure a permit from the Chief Burgess of said Borough, it is hereby repealed and made void and of no effect. The closing hour of the above mentioned places of amusement shall be the hour as prescribed by the Statue of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

All ordinances inconsistent with the foregoing repealed ordinance are here by repealed.
