

ORDINANCE 50

An ordinance providing for the extension of the general system of public sewerage in the Borough of Lilly, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, pursuant to a General Sewerage Ordinance, which was passed by Council on August 3, 1920, and for providing for the payment of the same and the collection of assessments thereon through the eastern extension of Main Street, and the several streets and alleys in that section of of Lilly Borough known as Smith's Hill, Smith's Alley, through Church Street, through Railroad Street, through Willow Street, through North Street, and also through a section of Washington Street.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Town Council of the Borough of Lilly, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that an extension to the general system of public sewers of said Borough to be constructed for the disposal of waste and surface waters and other sewerage matter in the said Borough; the mains, drains and branches thereof, shall be laid in the manner as prescribed by and under the direction of the Borough Engineer, according to plans and specifications herein after adopted over and under the eastern extension of Main Street, and the several streets and alleys, in that section of Lilly Borough known as Smith's Hill, Smith's Alley, Church Street, Railroad Street, Willow Street North Street and a part of Washington Street as follows:

(a) Beginning at the intersection of Main Street and Washington Street; thence extending through Washington Street a distance of one hundred and sixty (160) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

(b) Beginning at a point in Smith's Alley and Main Street extension or State Highway; thence through the said Smith's Alley, a distance of approximately one hundred and twenty-five (125) feet to Church Street; thence through Church Street a distance of two hundred and thirty-five (235) feet to the intersection of Railroad Street; thence through Railroad Street and the property of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company a distance of four hundred and ninety-six (496) feet to a point in Cleveland Street; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cottas pipe.

(c) Beginning at a point in Willow Street where the present sewer line ends thence extending through Willow Street to North Street a distance of one hundred and fifteen (115) feet; thence extending easterly through North Street a Distance of one hundred (100) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

(d) Beginning at the intersection of Willow Street and North Street; thence extending in a westwardly direction through North Street a distance of one hundred and twenty (120) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

(e) Beginning at the intersection of the eastern extension of Main Street and Main Street in the Borough of Lilly; thence extending along the said eastern extension of Main Street a distance of two hundred and forty (240) feet; thence extending still through the eastern extension of Main Street a Distance of two hundred (200) feet; thence extending through the proposed North Street extension a distance of one hundred and sixty-five (165) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra Cotta pipe.

(f) Beginning at a point at the intersection of North Street extended and the eastern extension of Main Street; thence extending through the eastern extension of Main Street a distance of one hundred and fifty-five (155) feet; thence through Short Street a distance of two hundred (200) feet to a point; thence extending through Clothes-Pin Alley a distance of two hundred and seventy-five (275) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

(g) Beginning at a point in Short Street and thence extending through Short Street a distance of one hundred and seventy five (175) feet to a point in Main Street; thence extending eastwardly through Main Street a distance of two hundred and sixty (260) feet; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

(h) Beginning at the intersection of Short Street and the eastern extension of Main Street, thence extending a distance of two hundred (200) feet to a point in the eastern extension of Main Street; thence extending easterly through the Eastern Extension of Main Street a distance of one hundred and sixty (160) feet to a point in High Street a distance of two hundred and sixty (260) feet to a point in High Street; thence through Clothes-Pin Alley a distance of one hundred and twenty-five (125) feet to a point; this sanitary sewer to be constructed of eight (8") inch terra cotta pipe.

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Section 2. That for the purpose of defraying the costs and expenses of said construction, the several properties fronting or abutting on the portion of the highway and streets, alleys, enumerated in Section 1 of this ordinance, within the Borough of Lilly are hereby assessed the sum of \$1.00 per foot front for every foot front of their respective properties. Providing, however, that where a property owner may own property that is located on a corner, and thus this property abuts on two streets, he may have an option of paying a sum that will pay for the foot front that is on the most narrow part; but in case a property owner may desire to tap the sewers running on both streets that pass his property, thence he must pay for the foot front that may be on both streets running past his property.

Section 3. The Borough of Lilly must lay the main sewers on the street and must tap into the main sewer and lay the service lines from the main sewer up to the curb of the property owner. The above sum of \$1.00 per foot-front shall be due from the property owners whether they tap the sewer or whether they do not. The secretary shall give the property owners notice of the sewer having been laid in front of their abutting properties. The said foot-frontage at the rate of \$1.00 per foot shall be due and payable as soon as sewer has been laid up to the curb of the property owner and notice of the same given by the Secretary.

Section 4. The method of collection for this money due from property owners for sewers and laying of sewer pipes shall be as provided by statute by suit of assumpsit or by regular municipal lien against property so assessed, as provided for in Borough's of this Commonwealth. This ordinance is passed pursuant to a General Sewerage Ordinance passed August 3, 1920. Any ordinance or part of ordinance conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance, be and the same are hereby repealed so far as the same affects this ordinance.
